## **Overview**

In 2019, the IKEA Foundation and the World Vegetable Center (WorldVeg) agreed to develop a 5-year initiative with a budget of € 6 million called "Veggies4Planet&People" (V4P&P), implemented by the WorldVeg and SNV (Netherlands Development Organization), with the aim to create jobs and income, particularly for youth and women, in the vegetable sector in Ethiopia and Kenya. At the same time, the objective was to improve environmental and human health through safe production of vegetables, cutting out chemical pesticides as much as possible, and replacing them with safe biopesticides. At farm level, V4P&P has been promoting regenerative agricultural practices with the aim to increase biodiversity, enrich soils, improve water utilization, enhance natural resources, and farm communities.

As the project is approaching its final implementation year (2024-2025), we want to share learnings about our research and development activities and approaches which have been contributing to the uptake of regenerative agricultural practices, improved vegetable seed and input supply systems, development of vegetable business networks (VBNs), improved incomes, and creation of jobs. We want to share and reflect on the project outcomes and lessons with the many partners in Kenya and Ethiopia who have been crucial in the implementation and success of the project. We also want to share our research and development outcomes with other development projects and research initiatives that promote regenerative agriculture and the creation of jobs in the vegetable sub-sector for women and youth. The conference will also provide opportunity for other initiatives to present their findings and lessons.

## **Objectives**

- 1. To share learnings about our research and development activities and approaches which have been contributing to project outcomes (regenerative agriculture, vegetable business networks, input systems, and policy) and indicators (adoption of regen ag, vegetable sales, and job creation).
- 2. To provide a forum for implementing partners and other development and research initiatives to share and reflect on these project outcomes and lessons.
- 3. To generate recommendations for research, development, and policy, as well as a V4P&P phase 2 project.
