TOMATOES

- 5-6 newly developed fresh market tomato lines with multiple TYLCD resistance (*Ty-3+Ty-2+ty-5*), bacterial wilt, and other resistances*
- 2-3 high anthocyanin and high carotenoid fresh market tomato lines*
- Demonstration trial of several BC₃F₃ whitefly resistant lines derived from crosses with *Solanum galapagense*



PEPPERS

- 8 newly developed lines of hot and sweet pepper (4 each) with multiple disease resistance (*Potato virus Y*, *Phytophthora capsici*, *Chili vein mosaic virus*, *Xanthomonas* sp. and *Ralstonia solanacearum*)*
- 2 newly developed Genic Male Sterile (GMS) lines with associated molecular markers and 3 newly developed Cytoplasmic Male Sterile (CMS) A- & B-pairs*
- Observational trial of 30 high performing and multiple disease resistant hot and sweet pepper F1 hybrids
- 60 hot and sweet pepper entries under preliminary yield trials with multiple disease resistance



CUCURBITS

- 5 newly developed bitter melon (*Momordica charantia*) lines resistant to powdery mildew*
- 5 newly developed pumpkin (*Cucurbita moschata*) F1 hybrids of different market segments with multiple virus resistance and 1 cucurbit powdery mildew (*Podosphaera xanthii*) resistant pumpkin line*

*Seeds of all these lines are available for distribution on 1 July 2020!
